I love being with campers and other leaders as we work and live in community, and I really appreciate the fact that it takes many different people coming together to make camp possible: the individuals who work in the kitchen, our camp managers and those who help maintain the facility, cabin counsellors, speakers, worship leaders, lifeguards, people to lead activities, games, crafts, archery, the campers themselves... the list goes on and on! We have the opportunity at PLCC to do things that we often don't do in our busy day-to-day lives, and take a moment to rest, refill, and focus our attention on Jesus and one another.

I am SO excited that we are able to run regular camp programming this summer for youth and children. We have week-long camps for various age groups, as well as other retreats and weekend family camps. I know many people from Oak Park are regular campers at PLCC and I can't wait to see you again, and meet some new faces as well!




New Series starting June 12th

You won't want to miss this! Jay and Colette, our missionaries in Poland, will be speaking at Oak Park Church on Sunday, June 12th. They will spend most of June in Canada, speaking at 13 different churches and travelling from the Atlantic to the Rockies. Please pray for them. They will needs lots of stamina! Colette completed five weeks of rehabilitation and has since received a new, much improved leg brace but she still finds walking very challenging. She recently celebrated her 60th birthday with lots of special gifts and visits from her students.

The war taking place in Ukraine has meant they have become very involved with supporting refugees in many different ways including rent, clothing, food, financial and emotional support, etc. When they visit they will share first hand stories of the opportunities God has given them to care. My name is Stephanie and I'm from LOT ministry. A few months ago God was really prompting some friends and I to start a street ministry downtown, where we bring food such as snacks and sandwiches, as well as clothing items for people at the Drop In Center every Friday night. It all started one Thursday morning. I wrote in our FaceBook chat group: "Praying for an unexpected donation today." About 20 minutes later my friend Chanelle picked me up from work and we drove past Oak Park Church of Christ and outside there was a sign saying, "Free bread and clothing." Absolutely shocked and giggling with excitement, we pulled into the parking lot. Once we were parked, we prayed to God that when we went in He would give us the words to correctly explain what we wanted to do.

We were very new at this and it was nerve wracking going in to ask for things. We had no idea what to expect or how they would receive what we were saying. However, as soon as we walked through the door we were warmly greeted by a couple of kind ladies and gentlemen. I explained what we were doing, and soon they were loading us up with more donations than we knew what to do with! Not only that but one of the gentlemen handed me money from his own pocket to put towards some of the other things we needed to buy. We left their so excited we could hardly contain ourselves. It was a true answer to prayer.

The following week we went back. The kind ladies and gentlemen working greeted us with the same excitement we had about being there. We were also given a cash donation from the church alongside the large amount of clothing, bread and other food donations. Oak Park Church of Christ and these donations have been absolutely key in helping us grow our street ministry. We couldn't be more thankful for this wonderful answer to prayer.

I once had the opportunity to be a Teaching Assistant for the principal of Wycliffe College, George Sumner. George is a great professor, a brilliant writer, and an exceptional leader. The class went well, but what I really remember most was spending time with George talking about institutional leadership. During our conversations, I asked how he had managed to take over leadership in a struggling college and turn it into a thriving one. He could have mentioned his leadership gifts or the faculty's hard work or even the renewed emphasis on student recruitment. Instead, he told me about an elderly lady who gave \$10 each month to the college. The year George became principal, she passed away, and in her estate she left \$1 million to the college. The chain of events that generous gift set off left a legacy of missional growth and gospel ministry that she likely never could have imagined!

We don't talk about legacy giving in the church very often. Perhaps we think it's morbid or unpleasant to address anything surrounding death (surely the church is one place we ought to be able to speak openly about death!); or perhaps we think it's presumptuous or rude; or perhaps we just don't really think about it – out of sight, out of mind. Well, I'm asking you to consider it now, for the future of our congregation. Legacy gifts don't have to be \$1 million dollars to be transformative!
