Fear Not.

Fear is a funny thing. I mean, not literally. There's really nothing funny about fear at all. What is funny is the push-pull reaction that it incites within us. Even the most risk-averse and fearful among us would admit that there is



something exhilarating about the rollercoaster or the scary movie or playing hide-and-seek in the dark. And yet, when we talk about "living in fear" the word that comes to mind is usually "debilitating," not "exhilarating."

The prophet Isaiah speaks God's word to us and it's as relevant today as when he first spoke it in the 8th c. BC. What did God say through Isaiah? To summarize in my own words, he said, "Look, the whole world is in a tizzy. There is panic, anxiety, fear, and the great unknown. But you, My people, My church, you ought to know better. Think of all we've been through. I'm not leaving you. I'm calling you to shake-off your fear – in fact, it's a command! You've gotta learn to trust Me and My plan for your life. You've gotta stay united together and encourage each other to feel My presence in your community. Don't worry, don't fear, cast your anxiety on Me – yes, you don't know the future – but I've got a firm grip on you as we walk into that future hand-in-hand."

If we can wrap our minds around it and open our hearts to it, we can begin to embrace it. We might even feel the power and exhilaration in our souls when we hear that command from Isaiah 41 that we're using as the title for our fall sermon series: FEAR NOT! Friends, let us hold fast the words of Jesus in John 16:33: "I have said these things to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world" (ESV). Amen and Amen.

Long Range Planning Team Update

By now you have likely become very accustomed to a regular update from Doug Walker, the Chair of our Long-Range Planning team. The absence of Doug's voice from this issue of the Park Bench is not cause for any alarm, it is simply an opportunity for me (Lane) to say a big thank you to Doug for his incredible work serving and leading the LRP team over a 6-year period! Doug's attention to detail, his ability to distill and hone-in on what needed to be done at any given time, and his determination to continue moving things forward has been a gift not simply to our staff and leadership, but to us as an entire congregation. Doug is not going anywhere and will continue to be integrally involved in our work, but I wanted to take this opportunity to say a public thank you to him for his service on the LRP team over these years.

This summer has seen a tremendous amount of work and preparation. One of the things I have so appreciated about the process the LRP team has helped guide us through is the insistence on full transparency. It's with that in mind that I'd like to provide my own succinct update on where things are at with our potential expansion and renovation project.

The LRP team has officially disbanded as of the end of August, as its work is complete. It has, however, given birth to two other teams that will carry different parts of the previous mantle. In all, there are three things you need to be aware of at this time:

- 1. The LRP team's dissolution will give rise to a smaller and more intentional industry-specific Construction Team. This team has three mandates: liaise with Kelly Seminoff of Bloom Architects on construction drawings and consultants; determine the best path forward if we proceed with construction as to choosing either a Construction Management company or an independent Project Manager; and finally, be in contact with our lender (Church of Christ Development Company) to secure a construction loan. If you or anyone you know is interested in being a part of this team, please contact me.
- 2. Alongside the formation of a Construction Team we have also begun to form a Campaign Cabinet or Leadership Team for our potential Capital Campaign that will kick-off later this fall. I am very excited to announce that Michael and Julie Kerr along with Rob Beingessner have agreed to co-Chair this team and have already begun preliminary work by meeting with and even soliciting some early donation pledges from our leadership.

3. These teams are already busy with preparation work and ensuring that we can pull together the most accurate information for you. Our goal is to have that information to you in early October so you can be praying about this opportunity and challenge that God has put in front of us. And then, since we felt that you weren't being asked to vote for enough things this fall (municipal and federal elections are upon us in case you weren't aware), we plan to have a congregational vote on whether or not to move forward with this project on a date TBD, likely in later October. We will give you as much notice as we possibly can. Be looking for an email information package from us soon. We want to be in this together as a united congregation!

Let me close by reminding you of something you likely already feel – this is BIG. It's a huge moment in the life of our congregation. Prayer cannot be understated and I am imploring you to please pray often about this and how you can be a part of the work to be done. Over and over again in God's word we are reminded of those who are rewarded for taking a step (or leap) of faith and how a risky thing can turn out to not be that risky when God shows up. Friends, we need God to show up here without a doubt and I, for one, cannot wait to feel my faith stretched and walk together with you on this journey. Please know that my door is always open for questions and I'm happy to talk to you further about any of this.


