Celebrating Our Community Partners: SouthWest Communities Resource Centre

Oak Park Church of Christ is blessed to have a good number of agency partners who help us widen our reach and touch the lives of more people in our community. Over the next few issues of the Park Bench, we will celebrate these partnerships and highlight how each one adds value to the work our church does.

We will begin in this issue by highlighting one of our longest standing community partners, the SouthWest Communities Resource Centre. Located in the Co-op mall, the 'SWCRC' provides resources, referrals, education, and prevention programs for vulnerable residents living in the SW quadrant of the city. For many who are having a hard time financially or struggling to get connected in the community, the SWCRC provides a convenient and friendly hub to find out about available resources and how to access them.

By using a comprehensive intake process, the SWCRC is able to pinpoint a family's most pressing needs and direct them to appropriate sources of help. Some might find the help they need through one of the 'in house' programs offered by the SWCRC, while others are referred to different agencies wher

agencies where their needs can be more adequately met. On occasion some of these families or individuals are referred to Oak Park where we can pray with them and look for creative ways within our means to help them.

For Oak Park Church, the SWCRC has been a very valuable and instrumental partner in helping us network with other agencies in our surrounding community. Because of this we have been able to participate in numerous outreach opportunities over the years, including the Community Christmas party we hosted last December as well as the Neighbour Day event held in our parking lot last June.

For the last ten years or so, Marylou Breig has been our main contact person at the SWCRC. Marylou's experience as a social worker combined with her gentle caring spirit have made her an absolute pleasure to work with. She will (cont'd on page 3)
