## **Summer of Construction**



When COVID-19 came into our lives last spring, it brought with it an abrupt change to our familiar routines and cancellation or postponement to many of our summer plans. Yet the familiar saying, "when God closes one door, He opens another" proved to be true for our church this summer as we were able to embark

on a few renovation projects - projects that would have been impossible to tackle under normal circumstances.

Among these were: a freshening of our foyer space, new paint and décor in the men's washroom, a complete makeover of the KidsPark worship room upstairs, and largest of all - major alterations to our sanctuary. This last project allowed us to fulfill a long-awaited desire for a designated Prayer Room, create significantly more (and very much needed) storage space, update and improve the stage lighting and sound system, and bring the Cross forward to a more prominent position above the Baptistry. #### **How to Create Your Breeze Account**

#### Step 1

Enter this link: https://
oakparkchurch.breezechms.com/login/create
or click on the "Create Account" link in the email we



have sent you. This will take you to a "Create User" screen. (Note: If you did not receive an email from us, or you are having trouble finding the Create User page, please call (403-251-5150) or email (office@oakpark.ca) the church office so that we can assist you)



#### Step 2

Fill out the information: create a username and password. For your username we recommend first initial and last name. For example: Sara Egely's username would be segely.

#### Step 3

Click on the "Create User" button. This will take you to the account created page.




#### Step 4

# Oak Park Missions Update Refuge of Hope



#### Vienna Moilliet - Refuge of Hope Shelter



Refuge of Hope has now been open for 3 months. The first 2 girls were ages 14 and 25 and now they have two more girls ages 9 and 12 who have also lived through terrible abuse. The staff is asking for prayer regarding 3 more sisters they would like to take in. At the shelter they experience safety, good food, lots of love, laughter, counseling, schooling online, Bible stories, cooking, jewelry making, art classes, singing and more. Some of the girls are just learning to read. Vienna has experienced some

real 'down' times with the enormity of the need and now her planned home coming in October is not a possibility. Please pray that her friend in the US will be able to join them and that they will be able to meet the increasing financial needs as they provide for all these girls. #### Paul and Mary Davis - Healthcare+ Ministries

Life has been extra challenging in Haiti as people cope with COVID and the resulting school, church, and business closures. Schools had just reopened in January 2020 after being closed all last fall due to many days of political protests. Then in March 2020 the government mandated that both schools and churches close. Pastor Ewal is blessed to have a radio station within his church which made it possible for him to encourage and teach his people both spiritually



as well as instruct them regarding COVID prevention. Donations were sent to help with cost and distribution of hand soap, Clorox, and food. The government provided masks. Packing and distributing the goods was a big undertaking for



the local congregation but an encouragement and blessing to all. Donations also continue to provide a lunch for the elementary school children (now that school has resumed), support for elderly widows, food help for the extremely needy as well as assistance for some very poor nursing students' school fees.

#### **Food Rescue Grant Report**



On April 29th we received a \$10,000 grant from Second Harvest's Food Rescue Program. The timing of this was a gift from God as we knew of so many families and individuals who were in need of food assistance especially due to the Covid-19 crisis. From May to August we supplied:

- -7 Emergency Food Hampers (impacting 14 adults & 13 children)
- -10 Grocery Gift Cards (impacting 9 adults & 16 children)
- -2 Special Food Banks (impacting 37 adults & 45 children)
- -7500 Meal Packs for The Mustard Seed (impacting Calgary's homeless people)
- -32 Snack Packs and \$200 for meat for StreetLight Program (impacting youth on Calgary's street)
- -\$250 allocated to purchase breakfast food for Cedarbrae School (impacting hungry children)
- -\$575 towards the purchase of a large chest freezer for the church.



Thank you to Kerry Grant (and her Food Bank Team) and Martin Hosier for their assistance with this huge undertaking!



We are excited to have recently been invited to be a beneficiary of Second Harvest's Surplus Food Rescue. This involves receiving large quantities of frozen food and fresh eggs to distribute to those in need in our community. As such, we were able to use some of our grant funds to purchase a large chest freezer. This was such a blessing and again we saw God's hand in the timing.

As this was an amazing opportunity to help so many, I met with the Directors of Tsuut'ina Nation's Men's Shelter and Food Bank and together we placed a large

order... how large you ask? 1,997 lbs of frozen meat and vegetables and 1,080 fresh eggs!! That's large! This food will help SO many people, and all of us are super excited!




On October 8, client packages are assembled, combining shopping, bread, used clothing, perishables, toys/household goods.

### **Long Range Planning Comittee Report**

First a quick refresher – over the past two years, through extensive consultation with Oak Park's Ministries, Staff, Elders and Board, the plans for Oak Park's facility upgrades have been updated to reflect the latest thinking for the best opportunities to enhance Oak Park's many ministries.

Exterior and main floor drawings will be included in the AGM package and are included again in this month's update.

The benefits to Oak Park's many ministries are extensive and exciting. Please refer to your AGM package for the full list of ministries to benefit and how.

With the conceptual plans complete the next two steps are:

- Determining the funding for the project, and
- Detailed construction drawings and a city development permit.

Construction could then follow, as early as the summer of 2021.

Determining the project funding has three phases:

- Review of Oak Park's financials and recent givings history. This work was completed earlier this summer by the Verger Group (again, refer to your AGM package for details on why we're using Verger) and they've provided an estimate for our potential fund raising, by comparing Oak Park's financials and givings history with other churches Verger has worked with. This review gives us the confidence to proceed to phase two.
- Interviews by the Verger Group with a cross section of Oak Park individuals and their preliminary estimates of project donations. This next step will confirm or revise their initial estimate through one-on-one interviews with a cross section of Oak Park's members and supporters. Those families to be interviewed have been notified already and those interviews are scheduled to occur between Sept 24th and 29th.

Not all church families will be interviewed – just enough to give Verger and the Long Range Planning Committee a firmer read on the project's fundraising potential. If the feedback from those interviews is strong enough, then we will proceed to phase three.

• Formal fundraising drive. This fundraising drive would likely occur early in 2021 and would involve Oak Park families and supporters making firm

pledges for capital fund donations over a three to five year period. The balance of the project would be financed through a low interest rate mortgage by the Church of Christ Development Company.

If the feedback from the interviews during phase two is strong enough, we will also begin our development permit application to the city, followed by detailed construction drawings. This work, to be done this fall and winter, would then clear the way for construction to begin over the summer of 2021.

#### Summer 2020 Renovations:

Most folks will know by now we also took advantage of the lock down to do some of the sanctuary renovations this summer. That work is complete and includes:

- Converting the Storage Room beside the stage to a Prayer Room.
- Stage modifications including storage under and behind the stage.
- Conversion of the space above the baptistry to storage.
- Upgrades to our audio and video systems.

That work is now complete and was done to high standards and brought in under budget, courtesy of Pastor Martin's stellar oversight. Many thanks to those families that contributed financially to this project this summer.
